#### GREEN SYNERGY: LINKING WASTE MANAGEMENT AND RENEWABLE

The Union of Municipalities of Türkiye (UMT) is a public institution that represents all municipalities in Türkiye on national and international platforms, advocates for and protects their rights and interests, strengthens their institutional capacities, and promotes international cooperation. Within the scope of the European Week of Regions and Cities (EURegions Week), UMT will host a session designed to connect municipal waste management practices and renewable energy opportunities.

Through "Green Synergy: Linking Waste Management and Renewable Energy," UMT aims to expand municipal knowledge and capacity on the circular economy, deepen engagement with European local authorities, and deliver concrete contributions to the local implementation of the EU Green Deal.

The session will explore how cities can transform waste from a costly disposal burden into a valuable resource, through circular economy approaches.

The session will be held in a **political/policy debate format**, bringing together decision-makers and technical experts to share good practices, innovative solutions, and strategic insights. The programme will combine concise presentations with interactive, participant-driven discussions. Drawing on real-world examples from Türkiye and across Europe, the session aims to foster mutual learning, inspire new collaborations, and generate ideas contributing to the implementation of the European Green Deal at the local level.

## **Main Topics:**

- Waste to Energy: Energy generation through methods such as biogas and pyrolysis, reduction of environmental impacts, legal and technical challenges.
- **Integration of Circular Economy into Cities** Awareness-raising and incentive mechanisms for citizens, SMEs, and NGOs to promote recycling, waste reduction, and active participation in the circular economy.
- Local Level Contribution to the European Green Deal Targets: Cooperation through joint pilot projects in climate change, renewable energy, and waste management and opportunities for accessing EU funds.

In this way, it is expected that sustainable partnerships between cities in Türkiye and Europe will be fostered, and the capacity of local governments to contribute to environmental goals will be strengthened. Within this framework, the event is expected to produce concrete outcomes such as the development of policy recommendations, the transfer of knowledge and experience, the promotion of cooperation and partnerships, and capacity building.
