

Event abstract

From 13 to 15 October 2025, on the occasion of the **23rd edition of the European Week of Regions and Cities (EURegionsWeek)**, the Sicilian Region - through the Regional Department for Programming - will take center stage with two initiatives showcasing Sicily's excellence and its commitment to sustainable development.

With "A Taste to... STAY: sustainable flavors of Sicily celebrating the #RightToStay", visitors will embark on a journey through the island's authentic tastes, with a particular focus on food sustainability, culinary tradition, and innovation inspired by the Mediterranean Diet. This initiative is part of the activities linked to Sicily's designation as **European Region of Gastronomy 2025**, offering a glimpse of the island's identity and attractiveness.

In parallel, as part of the **EURegionsWeek "Close to you" program**, the event <u>"STAY in Sicily - Sustainable Territories Activating Your potentials"</u> will take place at the Representation Office of the Sicilian Region in Brussels.

This initiative aims to highlight emblematic experiences and projects funded by the **European Regional Development Fund (ERDF) Sicily**, demonstrating how sustainable territorial development can provide citizens - particularly young people - with concrete opportunities to remain, return, or invest in their own land.

Organized under the thematic framework "The Right to Stay: unlocking the potential of every territory", the event will feature an exhibition and seminar pathway highlighting public-private projects in Sicily in the fields of digital connectivity, housing, sustainable mobility, innovative industry, and circular economy.

STAY in Sicily is not conceived as just a thematic event, but as a **strategic initiative** affirming the **#RightToStay in Sicily** through a sustainable, inclusive, and innovative development model supported by the **European Cohesion Policy**.

GENERAL OBJECTIVE To present the Sicilian Region as a *laboratory of territorial cohesion and* sustainable innovation, drawing on projects and testimonials that reinforce the right to remain through connectivity, local industry, mobility, and inclusion.

CENTRAL THEME | **BUL Sicily** "Connected to stay: ultra-fast broadband as a future infrastructure"

The BUL Sicily project is the largest infrastructure initiative designed to bring connectivity to















peripheral areas at risk of digital exclusion. It serves as a strategic lever to:

- counter depopulation,
- attract businesses and workers,
- ensure equal access to digital services,
- position Sicily as a "smart" and competitive territory.

Format and central theme

Within European policies for cohesion and sustainable territorial development, an essential principle is gaining ground: "The Right to Stay". This concept affirms the right of people - especially younger generations - to remain and thrive in their homeland, without being forced to leave in order to build their future elsewhere.

The initiative pursues several strategic objectives:

- Showcasing projects and practices that foster permanence, attractiveness, and vitality in Sicilian territories, demonstrating how local development can be sustainable, inclusive, and future-oriented
- **Strengthening** ties between the Sicilian Region and European institutions, fostering opportunities for dialogue, networking, and visibility in an international context
- **Connecting** stakeholders, youth, businesses, public authorities, and policymakers, encouraging collaboration and the exchange of good practices
- Positioning Sicily as a European laboratory of territorial cohesion, environmental sustainability, urban regeneration, and social innovationTo strengthen ties between the Sicilian Region and European institutions, fostering opportunities for dialogue, networking, and visibility in an international context.

The event will take the form of an *Open Day at the Sicilian Region's Brussels Office*, structured as a *hybrid format* combining exhibition, institutional sessions, and participatory moments:

- Thematic exhibition with six corners, each dedicated to a key dimension/project within STAY in Sicily (e.g. environment, innovation, enterprise, inclusion...)
- **Plenary session** with institutional speakers, European representatives, and testimonials from the territories
- Tasting and networking lunch, creating informal opportunities for exchange among participants













Thanks to the "distributed event with thematic corners" format, each project will have its own dedicated narrative space within the logical framework of "TheRightToStay". The audience will be free to interact, choosing their own pathway, exploring, engaging in dialogue. The plenary seminar will provide a central moment of collective reflection and institutional talks.

BUL - Ultra-Fast Broadband Sicily - CENTRAL THEME

Why?

- **Enabling infrastructure**: without modern connectivity there can be no territorial development; no one can "stay" competitively (students, businesses, public administration, digital health, etc.)
- Multiplier effect: BUL enables all other projects (industrial innovation by Magicmotorsport, smart accessibility of POP trains, improvement of Social Housing, etc.)













- Territorial inclusivity: marginal areas become connected and integrated into the global network
- **Economic resilience**: connected territories can retain young talent, attract smart workers (appealing also for non-Sicilians) and support businesses.

BUL Sicily is not simply "another project", it is the project that allows all others to thrive.

It connects the entire Region- from cities to small villages - bringing the network where it was previously absent. It reaches hundreds of municipalities, including depopulated and isolated ones, creating a digital backbone that supports other initiatives: from Social Housing to sustainable mobility (POP trains), to innovative companies also active in international markets (e.g. Magicmotorsport, Omer, BioTrak).

It aligns with **European objectives of digital transition and territorial inclusion**. In a disadvantaged region, reducing the digital divide has a concrete and strategic impact.








