


Objectives:

- Recover and revitalise the architectural and cultural heritage of Lousã
- Safeguard and valorise the tangible and intangible heritage of the surrounding landscape
- Involve the local population and attract tourism

Impact on local community:

- The castle became accessible and safe for both the local community and tourists
- Since its reopening, Lousã Castle has received an average of 35,000 visitors per year, making it one of the top reasons for travelling to Lousã and to Coimbra Region
- The local community is now able to promote the sustainability of its territory
